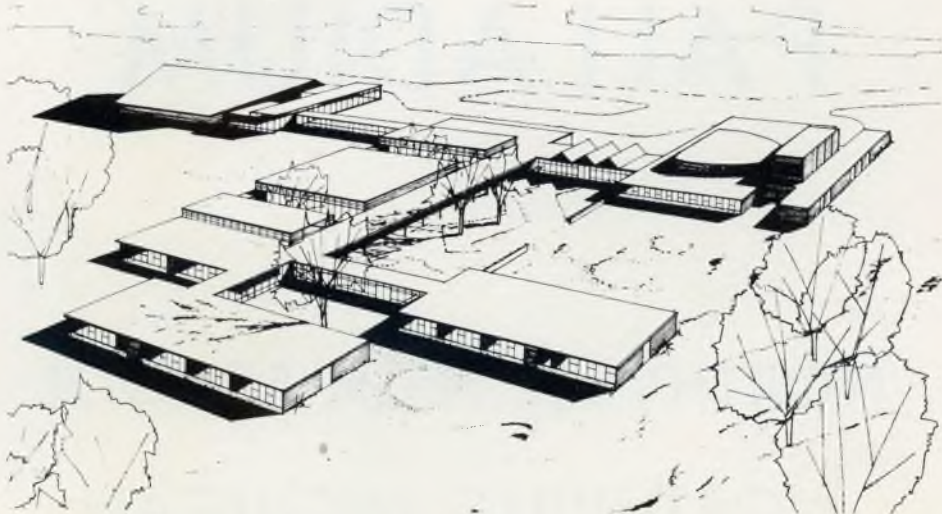

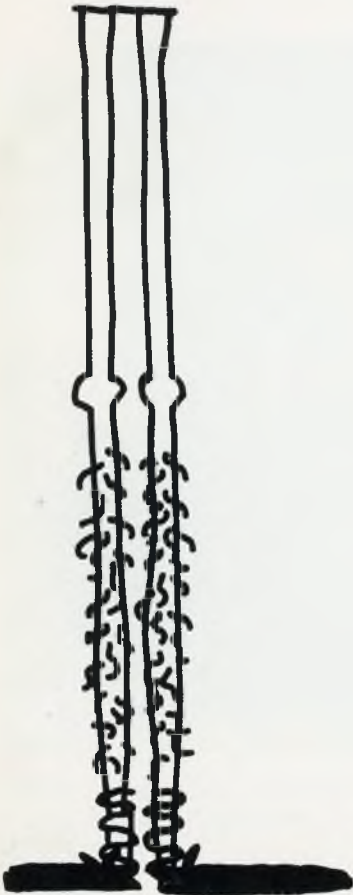

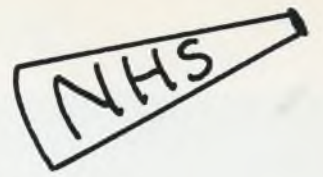
It's hard, especially for the new members, to forget the initiation.

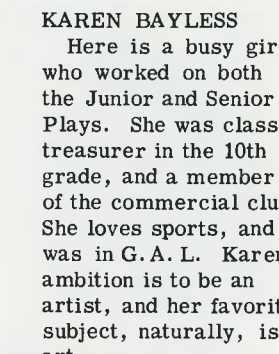
ROSALIE BAILEY

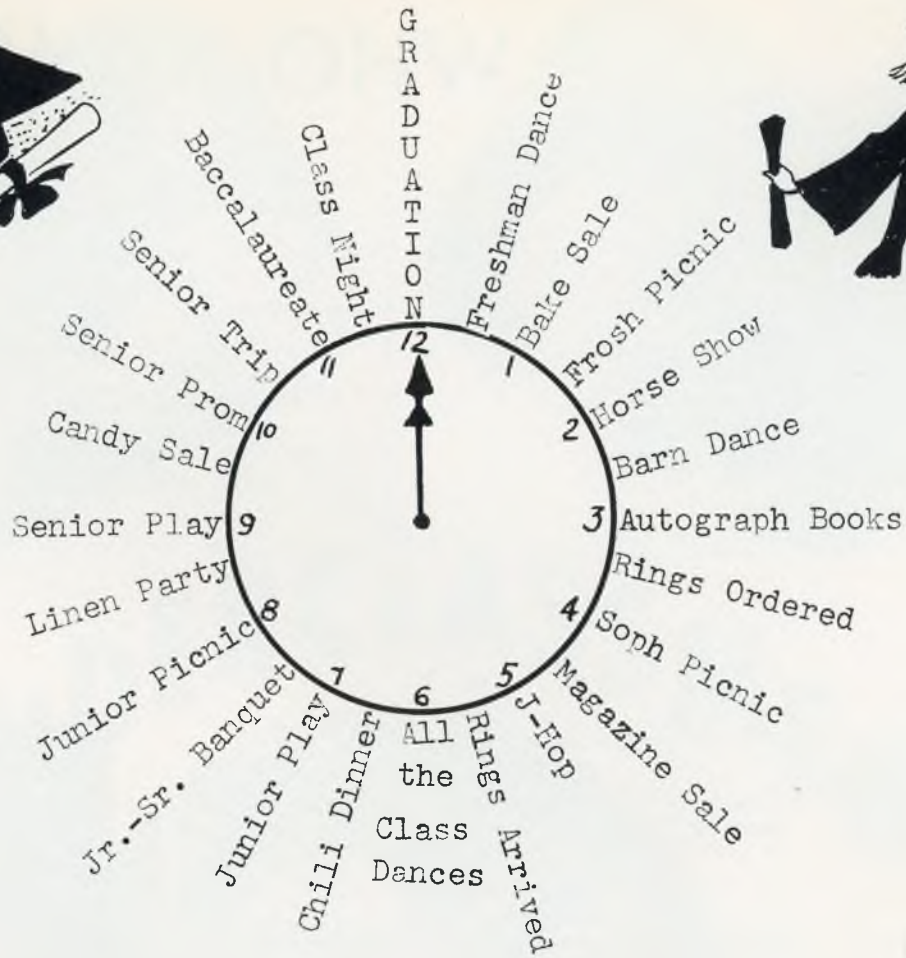
