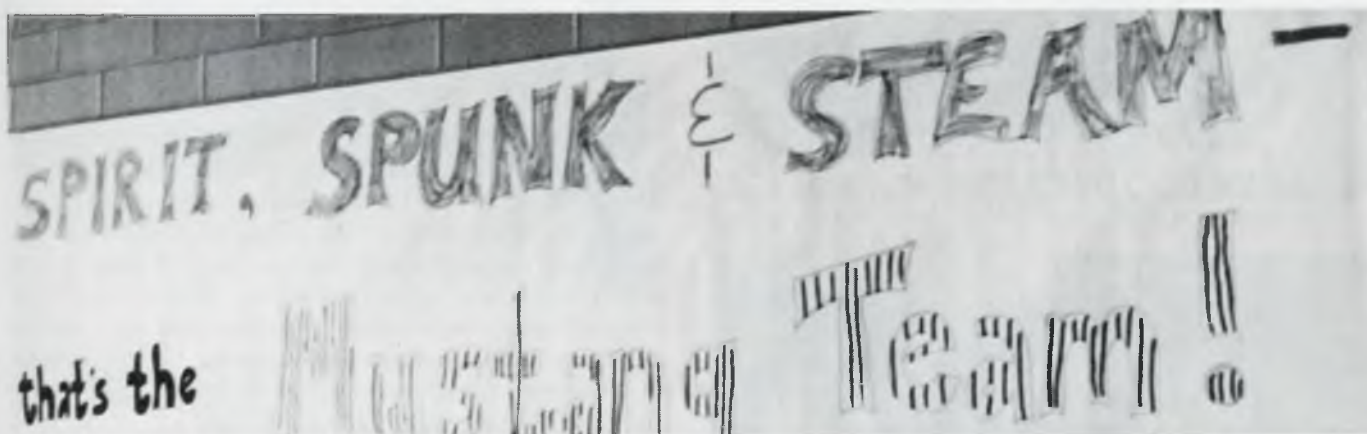

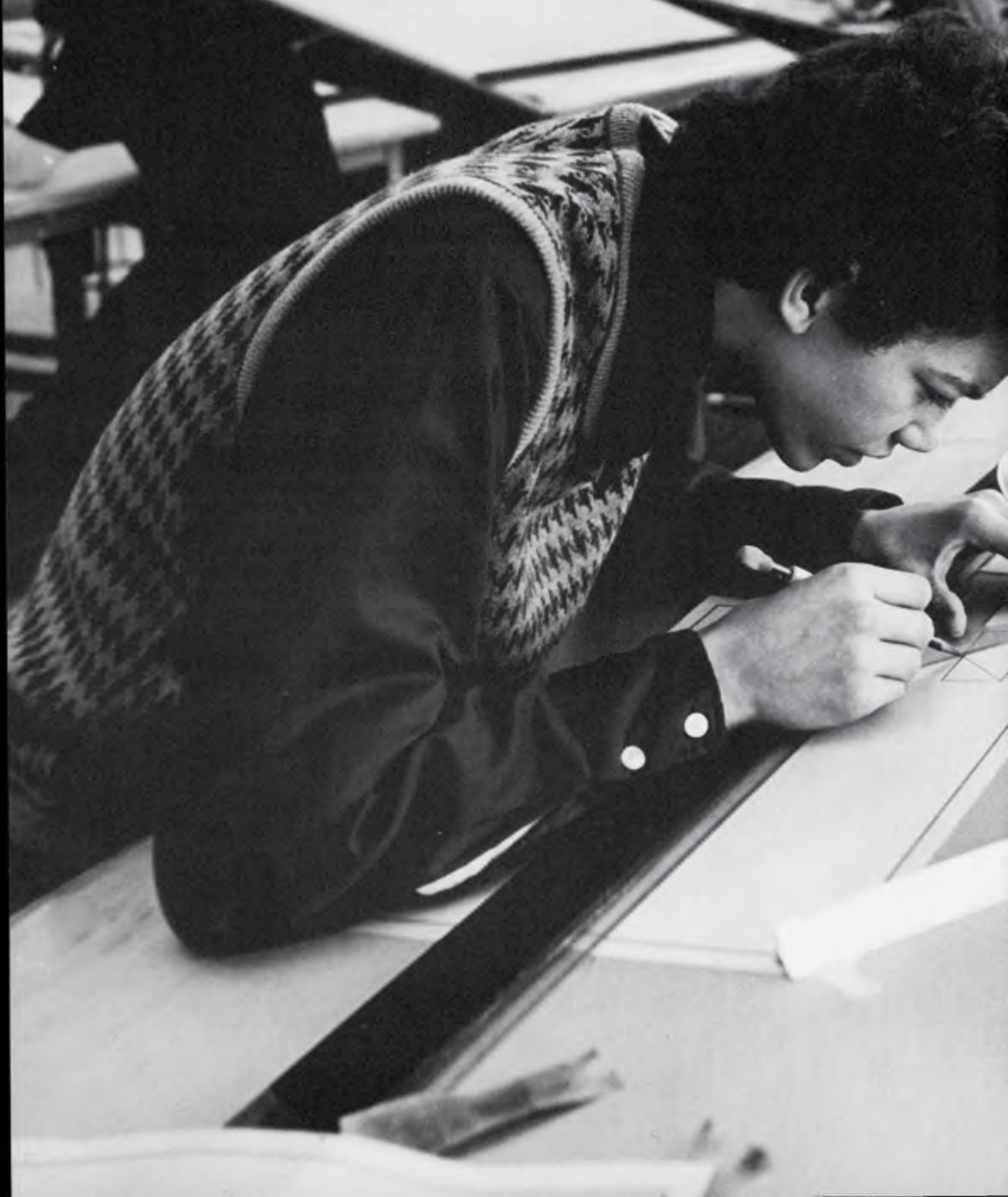

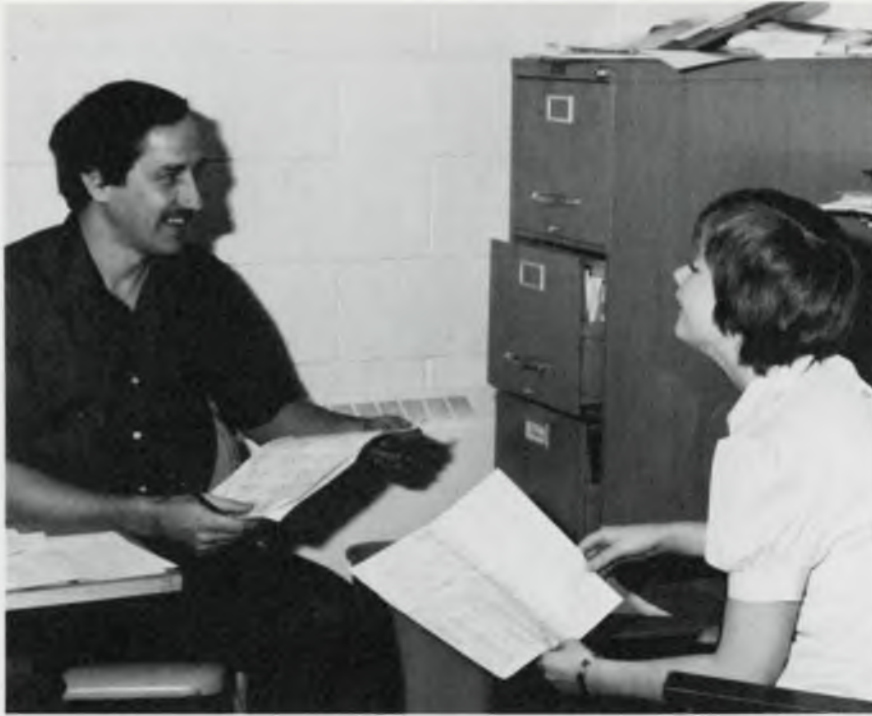

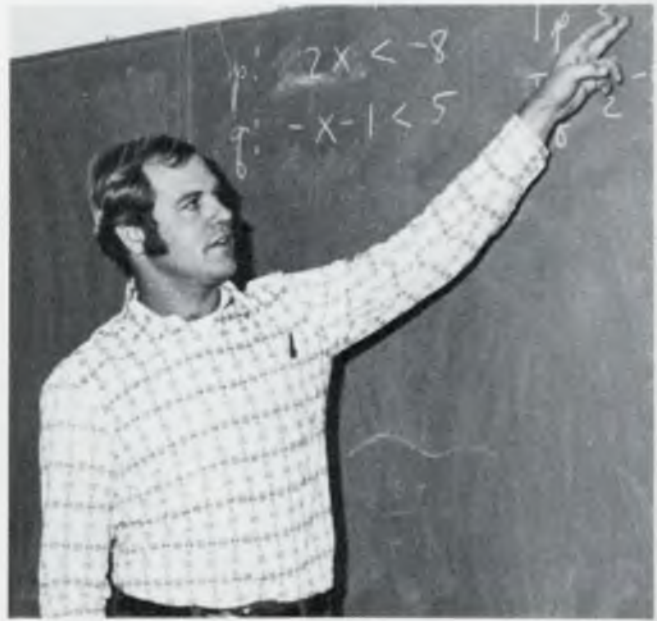




## Math Department Hopes To Get Computer Class

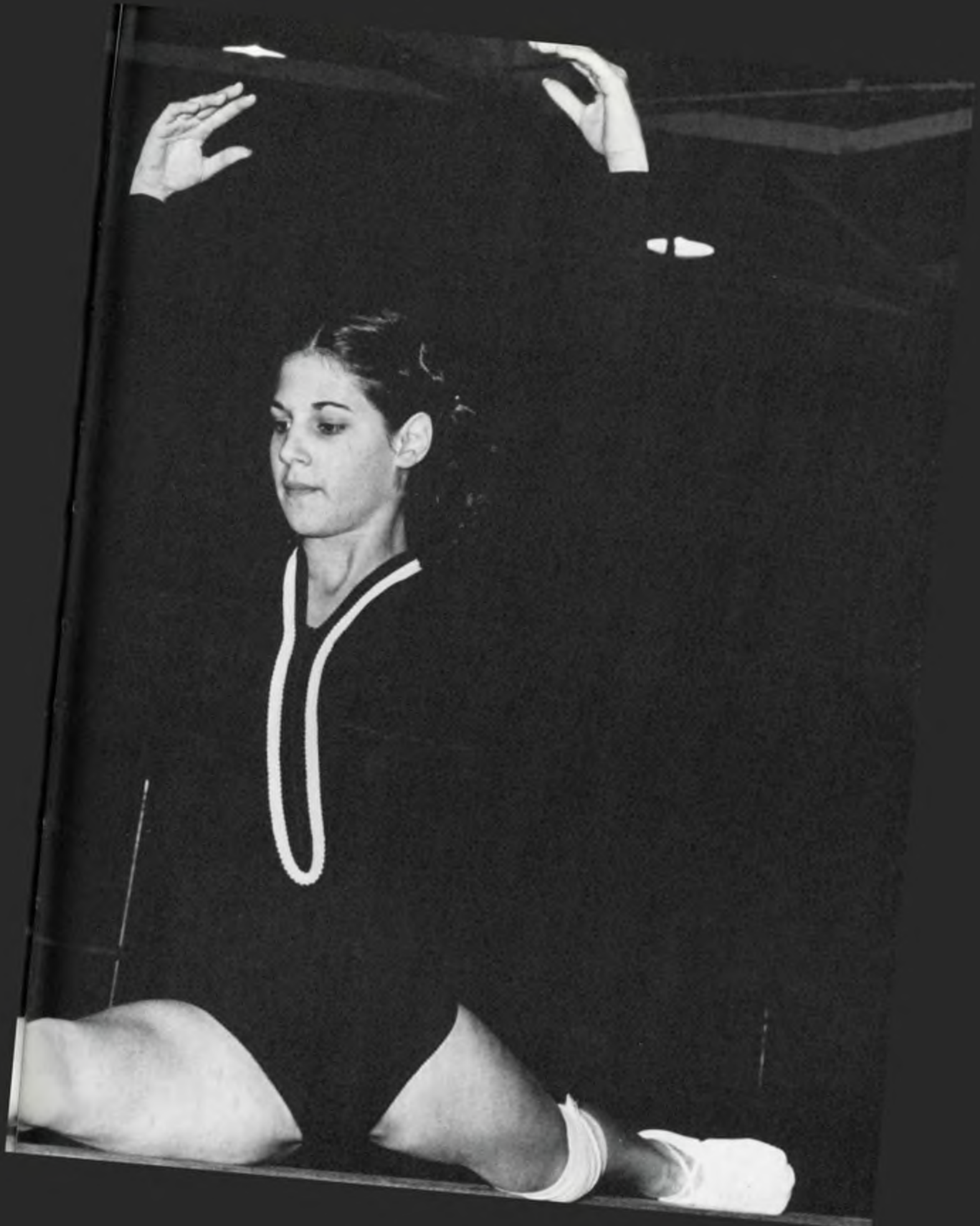

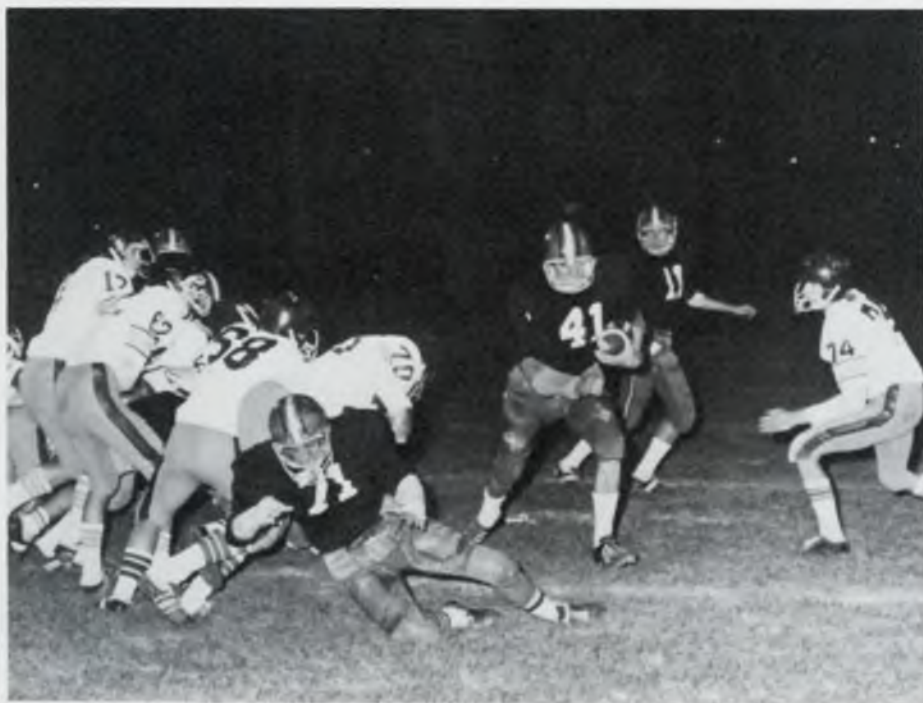

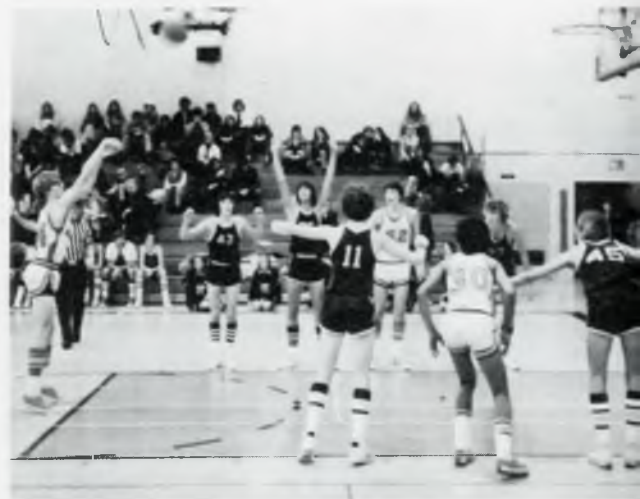

## *Gymnasts See Success As 6 Qualify for State*

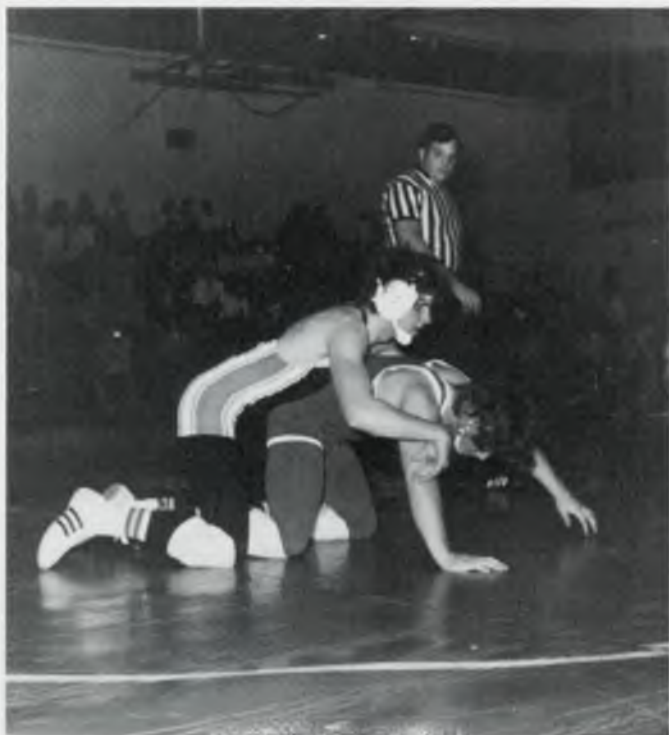

# Musclemen Muster Fifth Place in League Honors

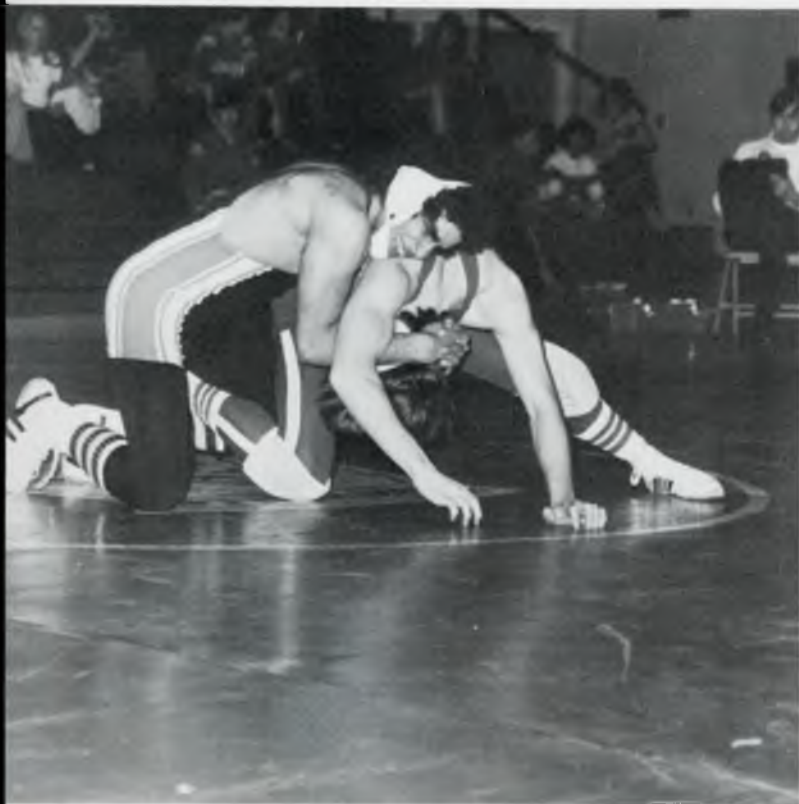

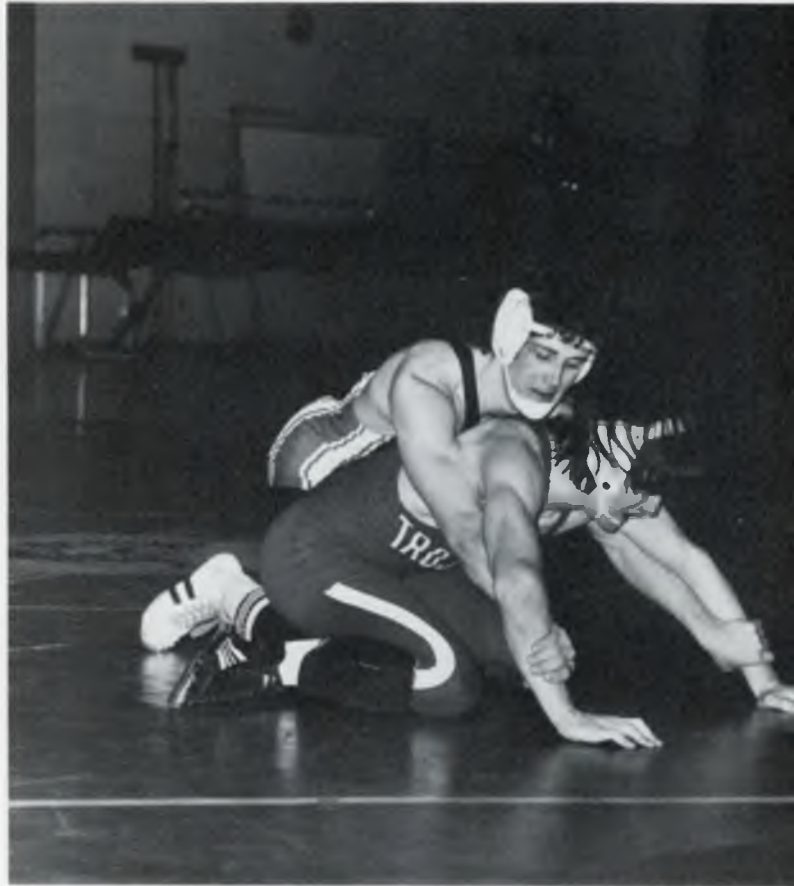
