

FOREIGN LANGUAGES ADD VARIETY







NHS IS "ART SMART"









SAW: STUDENTS AWARE OF THE WORLD

A new organization at NH5, Students Aware of the World, was conceived by President Jason Baker. The purpose of 5.A.W. is to fight for those who cannot fight for themselves. They work to educate themselves and the community about human rights, animal rights, and environmental concerns. Activities include Christmas caroling, 5.A.W. week(Jan. 8 to Jan. 12), rallies, petitions, and letters of influence. Fundraisers support both the local group and other organizations that share the same interests, such as Amnesty International, Greenpeace, and PETA. At the very first meeting on Oct. 26, 1989, almost 100 people attendeed; a large core group still attends. 
















WEST SIDE STORY

















CAGERS FINISH WITH ANOTHER WINNING YEAR


BEST SEASON IN FIVE YEARS






Above: Mike Lang leaps to prevent a Novi player from driving. Right: Joe Kaley takes a charge on defense against South Lyon.




WRESTLERS MIN DIVISION


TANKERS PLACE IN STATE MEET





HARRIERS SHOW PROMISE





WOMEN'S SOCCER ADVANCED TO REGIONALS








MEN'S SOCCER IMPROVES RECORD






MUSTANGS FINSH WITH A BANG


